Today's bulletin cover is the Luther Rose, also known as the Luther Seal, it is easily the most recognized symbol for Lutheranism and for good reason. Martin Luther personally oversaw the creation of this symbol. It provides a beautiful summary of his faith, a faith that is common to all Christians, of every place and time.
